Summer Construction South District Water Improvements

For the 2010 construction season, the District is moving forward with two major projects to improve water distribution in the South District:

1) A new pump station along Alpenglow near the intersection with Val D'Isere Circle. This new pump station will improve fire-flow availability in the Laurel Lane, Ski Trail Lane and Anthony Circle neighborhoods and provide an alternative supply of water to these neighborhoods in case of a main break.

2) An upsized water supply main from Walton Creek Road to Bear Drive to improve the performance of the 750,000 gallon South Tank that supplies the South District and improves fire-flow to south Apres Ski Way and Val D'Isere Circle. The project will involve the installation of 1,500 feet of 14-inch water main from Walton Creek Road along Columbine to Apres Ski Way and 1,000 feet of 12-inch pipe to Bear Drive.

WATER CONSERVATION

Did you know that your household summer water usage can be three times higher than your winter use?

- Most of this increase is lawn sprinkling.
- Learn how to operate your irrigation system.
- Check your irrigation system for leaks.
- Most homeowners over-water their lawns.

We recommend watering every 3rd day for only 20 minutes.

REMEMBER ASCENDING VOLUME RATES

- Tier I 0 to 95 cubic meters = .23
- Tier II 96 to 420 cubic meters = .40
- Tier III 420 cubic meters = .81
- Commercial irrigation meter = .40
- One cubic meter = 264.17 gallons



As much as 30% of water can be lost to evaporation by watering lawns mid-day.
