## **Mount Werner Water District Begins Work On Timothy Drive System Upgrade**

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, Colo. (Aug. 1, 2006) – The Mount Werner Water & Sanitation District today announced that it has begun work on a new water main in the Timothy Drive neighborhood.

Excavation and installation will take approximately nine days, with testing and inspections to follow into the week of Aug. 14. Clean-up and restoration work will continue through Aug. 25. Residents in the area have received letters of notification, and District representatives have met with residents directly affected.

The upgrade is designed to improve the water system and strengthen fire-fighting abilities in the area. As previously announced, the District has begun installing 43 fire hydrants, 23 of which are planned for this year; and nine of those are already complete.

Prior to construction, work crews will have to remove any obstructions such as fences, bushes and landscaping rocks that may lie in utility easements or in the city right-of-way. In such circumstances, the District will work with residents to mitigate the impact of construction.

The Mount Werner Water & Sanitation District treats and distributes water for the mountain resort area of Steamboat Springs and, under agreement with the City of Steamboat Springs, provides water to the City Water District for distribution to its customers. Under agreement with the City, the District also provides the infrastructure for the collection of wastewater from the resort area which is routed to the City's interceptor line that leads to the City's wastewater treatment plant west of Steamboat Springs. The Mount Werner Water District, formed in 1965, is a Special District pursuant to State Statute and is a political subdivision of the State of Colorado. An elected five-member board of directors governs the District.
