Mount Werner Water District Names Board Executives

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, Colo. (June 22, 2006) – The Board of Directors of the Mount Werner Water and Sanitation District has elected Jon Halverson president of the District and chairman of the board. He succeeds Tim Borden, whose 15-year term expired recently.

The board also elected Nancy Mayer vice-president and Stephen Gale treasurer. Jay Gallagher, District Manager, remains as secretary.

Halverson has been a board member since December 2004. He is retired from the law firm of Davis Graham & Stubbs after a 28-year career as a natural resources attorney. He was a member of the board of directors of Strings in the Mountains from 1994-2001 and chairman from 1998-2001; and he was on the board of the Yampa Valley Land Trust from 1993-95. He served on the Colorado Council of the Nature Conservancy from 1996-2004, and he is currently on the Local Advisory Committee in Routt County.

Borden continues in his commitment to public service with his role on the board of trustees for the Lowell Whiteman School in Steamboat Springs.

About Mount Werner Water & Sanitation District

The Mount Werner Water & Sanitation District treats and distributes water for the mountain resort area of Steamboat Springs and, under agreement with the City of Steamboat Springs, provides water to the City Water District for distribution to its customers. Under agreement with the City, the District also provides the infrastructure for the collection of wastewater from the resort area which is routed to the City's interceptor line that leads to the City's wastewater treatment plant west of Steamboat Springs. The Mount Werner Water District, formed in 1965, is a Special District pursuant to State Statute and is a political subdivision of the State of Colorado. An elected five-member board of directors governs the District.
