Summer Watering Schedule

The permanent every-other-day watering schedule will help us to achieve lasting, long term improvement in water efficiency and conservation. Exceptions to this may be made for District and City of Steamboat Springs approved management purposes. Odd and even watering schedule provided below. The watering schedule is based on the last number of customers' street addresses. No outdoor watering between 10AM – 6PM and **no watering on Wednesday's**

- If the last number of your address ends in an even number your watering days are: Sunday, Tuesday and Friday
- If the last number of your address ends in an odd number your watering days are: Monday, Thursday and Saturday

Tips for summer irrigating:

- Double check your timer throughout the summer in case of a power outage
- Double check sprinkler heads in case one gets damaged
- Turn off your sprinkler system if it has rained

Fish Creek Treatment Plant Facilities Master Plan Update

Phase 2A is complete aside from a couple of touch up items to be finished this spring. The electrical improvements now ensure that the Fish Creek Plant can safely handle anticipated future electrical loads and the new gear has surge suppression, power monitoring capabilities and a transfer switch for a future standby generator. The 2M gallon tank had baffle curtains installed in order to create more chlorine contact time in order to increase the disinfection process time. (Photo below shows the new transformer being installed at the Fish Creek Plant.) Phase 2B is in the design and planning stage with construction planned for 2024. This phase will include a new chemical storage building and

Final Phase- Sewer Interceptor Update

The final phase of the project is substantially complete with electrical and control tasks finished in January at two of the new monitoring manholes. This spring irrigation repairs, sod installation, asphalt paving, and final clean-up will be the last few tasks for final completion. Phase I of the project started

August 5th of 2019 with two subsequent phases since then and approximately 5,600 total linear feet of piping installed. The project first started at Fetcher Park to Highway 40 & Mt. Werner Rd, along the underpass and continuing to the Tennis Bubble and ending at Ski Town Park. The new and bigger PVC piping will ensure that future demands can be met within the District. Thanks to everyone for their patience during construction and to Native Excavating who completed the install.

Snow Depth and Snow Water Equivalent (SWE)

Colorado snowpack has topped 140% of average as of the last week in March. The Yampa Basin is also nearing historic highs, with snowpack at 145% of average according to the Natural Resources Conservation Service Snow Survey. These averages are based off of data collected since 1991. The snow water equivalent at the very end of March was 50". Within Colorado, statewide reservoir storage this month stands at 80% of average, up slightly from this time last year when it registered 75% of average.
